



Knollwood C. C. Recap: September 6, 2017

The MSGA's ninth tournament of the 2017 season was held at Knollwood (East) C. C. in Granger, IN on September 6th. This was the seventh MSGA tournament played at Knollwood over the years and the staff did a very nice job with lunch and the course.

The turnout was a little less than expected with 87 players entered.

The day's weather was not a good day for golf with cool temperatures in the low 60's and intermittent rain and drizzle mixed with sunshine and clouds. As for the golf course, it was in nice condition for a late summer date. The fairways were in perfect condition providing lots of perfect lies. The rough was very thick and sometimes difficult for those who ventured there. Several of the large greens provided for long tough putts. Overall, the course played very fair for the players as demonstrated by the many good scores. With the rain, four players did not finish and did not post scores.

Overall with handicaps, 27 players bested par of 72 while ten others matched par. For the 83 players who finished, the average Gross score was 90.0 with 73.7 as the average Net score, 1.7 shots over par.

In the Individual Medal competition, Stu Holaway lead the field with a three over par 75 (round included three bogeys and 15 pars) followed closely by Tom Knoll with 76 and Tom Smith and Tony Fallucca with 77's. Six others shot scores in the 70's.

In the Net competition, Peter MacEntee was the winner with a ten under par net 62 for the overall low-net for Flights A-D. Next in line was Gary Drutis with a net 63 followed by Lee Burdorf with a net 65 and Bob Dunn with a 67. Ten others shot net 68 or 69.

The low-net winner in Flight E (played from the forward tees) was John Behee with a net 62 followed by Bruce Wargo with 67. Eleven players played in Flight E (players whose age plus handicap equals 95).

In the Skins competition, Bruce Wargo was the only multiple winner with two skins. In total, there were 21 skins in the five flights.

In the Closest-to-the-Pin contest, the best of the day was Robert Woolever's shot that stopped one foot two inches away on the 141-yard Hole #14.

In the season long Brady Cup competition, Stu Holaway holds the lead with 1355 points followed by Bob Dunn (1305) and Abe Ismail with (1265). Roy Shepard and Dave Dunn hold the fourth and fifth positions with one event left on the schedule. The Top-25 standings are shown on the Brady Cup tab.
