

Rock Hollow G. C. Recap

The MSGA's sixth tournament of the 2025 season was played at Rock Hollow G. C. in Peru, IN on July 14th.

The tournament had a total of 86 players registered (including three guests) with all players finishing rounds and included in the results. For 2025, the MSGA has continued using three sets of tees, which are Back (Gold tees), Middle (Blue tees) and Front (Green tees). Flights A & B play from the Gold tees, Flights C & D play from the Blue tees and Flights E & F play from the Green tees.

Players choose the tee of their choice: 30 played the Gold tees, 36 played the Blue and 20 played the Green. The only limitation; a player's age plus Handicap Index must be 85+ to play the Green tees.

The weather was very good for golf with sunshine, a nice light breeze for the last few holes, and temperatures in the mid to upper 80's. The golf course was in excellent condition with nice tees, fairways and beautiful bunkers. The greens were pretty normal for speed, but large with plenty of slopes and valleys.

Overall, the course played normal vs. par with handicaps as only four players bested Net par of 72 but eleven matched. For the 86 players, the average gross score was 89.5 with an average net score of 77.1 (5.1 over par), which was in the normal range of 3-6 over par.

In the Individual Medal competition for gross scores by flight: Ron Dockery posted 75 in A flight, Kevin Reichard and Robert Dragani posted 81's in B flight and John Chamberlin had 79 in C flight. Woody Woodiwiss recorded 87 in D flight, Chuck Zimmerman shot 81 in E flight, and Biff Tadros shot 89 in F flight.

In the Individual Medal competition for Net, Steve Hissong lead with an excellent Net 65 in B flight followed by John Chamberlin with 67 in C flight. Robert Dragani and Kevin Reichard had 68's in B flight and Bill Dekker and Andy Dosmann recorded 69's in D flight. Dan Kaleth was the only other to break Net par with a 71 in E flight.

In the Skins competition, Steve Hissong (B) posted four skins while Jim Galt (B), Jeff Hazel (C), Jim Jeselnick (E) and Bruce Fisher (F) recorded two each. In total there were 32 skins.

In the Closest-to-the-Pin contests, Fred Hillis' shot on Hole 4 finished 2' 6" from the hole playing from 112 yards on the Green tees.

Congratulations to the award winners. Players pick up awards at the next event they play.

After six events in the season-long Brady Cup standings, Brian Gensel leads with 903 points followed by Robert Dragani with 877 points and Tom Moser with 871 points.
